

The Centre for Humanitarian Action e.V.

The Centre for Humanitarian Action e.V. (CHA) is a think tank founded in 2018, which engages in independent analysis, initiates critical debate and spreads the word about issues of humanitarian assistance and its for key principles: humanity, impartiality, independence and neutrality. It is Germany's first think tank on humanitarian action.

The CHA is an initiative of humanitarian non-governmental organisations to strengthen German and international humanitarian action. Caritas Germany, Diakonie Katastrophenhilfe, Doctors without Borders Germany and the German Red Cross (DRK) are the institutional partners of CHA and provide the basic funding. In addition to its institutional partners, CHA is financially and non-materially supported by other organisations, including Action against Hunger, Danish Refugee Council (DRC), Handicap International / Humanity & Inclusion (HI), Help – Hilfe zur Selbsthilfe e.V., the International Rescue Committee (IRC), Islamic Relief Deutschland e.V., Johanniter International Assistance, Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC), Oxfam Germany, and Save the Children Germany.

The CHA cooperates with aid organisations such as German and international non-governmental organisations or UN agencies, with governments and with actors from academia and politics. It is not meant to be a purely academic institution, nor to represent humanitarian organisations vis-à-vis the German Federal Government. The Centre rather builds a bridge between academic analysis of humanitarian action and projects and programmes in the field. It also bridges and connects international discussions and the debate in Germany. The results of its work and the related recommendations are freely accessible to all actors.

In close cooperation with the member organisations, the CHA decided on its second work programme at the end of 2021. According to this programme, the four main research areas until the end of 2024 are:

- Policy and strategy capacity of German humanitarian actors
- Opportunities and risks of digitalisation for German humanitarian actors
- Localisation in practice: partnership in humanitarian project and risk management and
- Climate Change and Humanitarian Change
